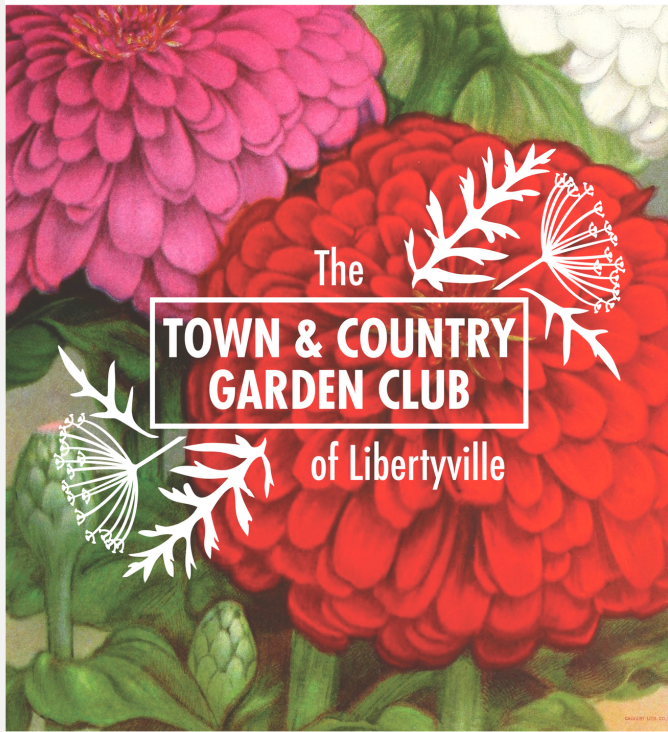

An interesting new movement is "No Mow May". The goal of No Mow May is to allow grass to grow unmown for the month of May, creating habitat and forage for early season pollinators. This is particularly important in urban areas where floral resources are often limited. To also encourage pollinators, we've planted milkweed hoping to get a firsthand look at the monarch life cycle. Important note: Milkweed seed must undergo three weeks of cold stratification. Click [HERE](#) for more information on this essential process.
